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

Green Week 2005

We would like to remind you of the Green Week 2005 that was announced in the January edition of the International Eco-Schools Newsletter. Just in case you have missed the invitation, we are reproducing it once again below. We would greatly appreciate if you could keep us informed about your participation.





The European Commission invites all children in the enlarged EU and candidate countries, aged between 6 and 16 years, to take part in its **Green Week Schools Competition 2005**. The competition is part of the annual Green Week conference and exhibition, which will take place from 31 May to 3 June 2005 in Brussels. This year the competition highlights the theme of **Climate Change**.

Younger children may create drawings and paintings illustrating their views about climate change, while older pupils are invited to submit a short digital video on the same subject. The three best entrants in each category of the competition will win a trip to Brussels, accompanied by a parent or guardian. They will receive a prize and also get an opportunity to meet the European Commissioner for the Environment, Mr. Stavros Dimas. The competition is open to schools in the enlarged EU and candidate countries. This year there are two competition categories:



(a) A Drawing and Painting Competition for Children aged 6-10

In the competition for the younger age group, children are invited to send in drawings or paintings illustrating their ideas on climate change. Children could draw or paint possible changes to their local ecosystems caused by global warming or illustrate ideas on how air pollution and climate change may be prevented. The best 20 entrants will have their paintings displayed at the Green Week Exhibition.

(b) A Short Digital Video Competition for Young People aged 11-16

Older children are asked to work in teams of several pupils. They should make a short digital video on climate change. The video should be no more than three minutes long, and shouldn't include any text or speech. The children can show what causes climate change and give ideas on how they can make a difference by changing their behaviours. Creative approaches will be awarded. The top 20 entrants will be shown at the Green Week exhibition.

Entries and Judging

Entries may only be submitted with the support of a school. Entries must be scanned, or created digitally, and sent to the Environment Directorate-General **(deadline 15 March 200**5) via the entry forms on the Green Week School Competition website accessible in 20 languages at: **www.greenweek2005.eun.org**

Teachers are encouraged to make the competition part of a class activity and the web site will offer some ideas and support. A panel of teachers and environmental experts from all over Europe will assist the European Commission in carrying out the judging.

ENO Schools

Have you been wondering how to use ICT in your teaching or find interactive ways in learning? Are you interested in environmental issues and global education? Would you

like to improve your teaching, and meet colleagues from all over the world? This is your chance!

ENO-Environment Online is a global web school for environmental awareness. Four environmental themes (dimensions sustainable development) are studied within a school year (Social, Natural, Cultural Environment and a sustainable way of living) on a weekly basis. ENO Program is a strong and active network of schools. It has been running since 2000 and it is administrated by the city of Joensuu, Finland. Over 180 68 schools from countries currently



participate in this program. ENO is a truly international web school for kids! **Unfortunately there are no Maltese schools participating in this initiative.**

The main idea is to lay emphasis on local environment and see it from a global perspective: act locally - think globally. Information is gathered in local communities and shared globally in the website. Learning is student-centred, both online and offline activities. At the end of each theme there is a campaign week when students share their results and raise them up in their local communities. They become eventually ambassadors for environment in their respective local communities and regions and worldwide.

ENO is a well-known program supported by the European Commission and National Board Of Education. We have received many international awards. And above all, this is currently a free service for your school!

Sounds interesting? Why not become a member!! We will choose approximately 200 new schools to become members for school year 2005 -2006. The deadline for applications is March $31^{\rm st}$ 2005. The official list of ENO schools will be announced on April 2005 on the ENO website.
